A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

This weekend we begin a new chapter at St. Anne's with a new music director. Please welcome John Montanero to our community. He has many ideas for music and liturgy and he will be introducing them to us in the coming weeks and months.

We also welcome our newly hired Office & Ministry Coordinator, Rachelle Harmon, to our parish. Her working hours will be primarily from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., Monday through Thursday. If you should need anything she is the one to see.

And I wish to thank Aileen Baker for her continued dedication to our parish with her expertise in accounting along with her husband's continued support for our community.

As we near the end of the Easter season and with Pentecost just a few weeks away, let us pause to take in what we have experienced spiritually and the beauty of Christ's sacrifice.

This is also a time in which we return to ordinary time. What is ordinary time some have asked? We think of ordinary as that, ordinary. But the church doesn't use this term in the sense of "with no special or distinctive features; normal." Ordinary time in the Church, is described as such: "the word, 'ordinary' is used when referring to the liturgical season, "Ordinary Time". In this context, "ordinary" comes from the Latin term ordinalis, which means "numbered" or "ruled". It can also be "ordered". This is also the origin of our word for "ordination". The term "Ordinary" is also used to describe the bishop, for example: A diocesan bishop, as distinct from a suffragan, assistant, or coadjutor bishop. The term apparently springs from the understanding of "ordinary jurisdiction" which is held in canon law to be the jurisdiction permanently and irremovably annexed to "the office of bishop". Ordinary Time includes the days between Christmastide and Lent, and between Eastertide and Advent. The liturgical color assigned to Ordinary Time is green, which represents "Hope". With the last Sunday of Ordinary Time being the Solemnity of Christ the King.

It is important to understand these terminologies if one is truly interested in the everyday workings of the church. If one is to understand fully their faith, then one should also grasp the meaning of the liturgical calendar and how it guides our faith through the seasons of the year.

After Pentecost and the first Sunday of Ordinary Time, our music director will be introducing newer styles of music in cooperation with the pastor and cantor. I am looking forward to the direction John will be taking us as we continue our spiritual journey. It is my hope as we learn together and partake in the liturgy we come to appreciate the structure of the mass and its deeper Scriptural meaning and comprehend the uniqueness of the ritual that Christ gave us in the upper room before his death. God bless.
